

"What do YOU think of 4th Ave?" Community Survey Results from Online Survey, March - April 2024

Almost 10 years ago, Forth on Fourth Avenue (FOFA) hosted an online survey and public meeting to call attention to issues on 4th Ave in Brooklyn and to begin constructive conversations and advocacy with then newly elected Council Members Brad Lander and Stephen Levin. Both the survey and the meeting were enthusiastically received – we had 390 responses and standing-only meeting attendance at the Old Stone House in January 2014.

That was then. Today, close to half (42%) of the 4th Ave residents responding to the 2024 survey are new to 4th Ave (living here 1 - 5 yrs). They may not know about the recent changes or existing plans for improvements on 4th Ave, and certainly most did not attend our meeting 10 years ago. The pace of development on 4th Avenue has been astonishing; there are dozens of new buildings and hundreds of new, or about to be new, residents in the neighborhood. It was time for a new survey and we are thrilled that over 600 people responded! In addition, two-thirds of respondents asked to be placed on the FOFA email list, a sign that they want to keep up with 4th Ave updates.

The online survey was open for 5 weeks and received over 600 responses; many people also added in-depth written comments. While the results are not scientific or strictly representative, we feel the results offer important feedback from the community about priorities and ideas to move forward on 4th Avenue together.

First, we asked **"What is your relationship to 4th Ave?"** and found that the vast majority (75%) LIVE on 4th Ave or adjacent side streets. A majority also said they "Visit businesses, go to church or seek services on 4th Ave" (67%) or "Travel on 4th Ave" (63%). We also asked whether people rent (37%) or own (63%) and how long they have lived on 4th Ave or nearby. Forty-two percent were relatively new to 4th Ave (living here less than 5 years), 31% lived here in the 6-19 year range, and 23% lived here over 20 years. See charts below for specific data.

Next questions were: "Which of the following 4th Ave street-level issues are most important to you?" and "What would you like to see on 4th Ave? If there were sufficient resources, what would be your top choices for improvements along 4th Avenue?" Data is tabulated below and on charts.

Most Important Street-level Issues

- Greening (trees, median planters and open space) 79%
- Pedestrian/Bike Safety 74%
- Promoting Active & Welcoming Street Life 66%
- Sanitation/Clean Streets 62%

Followed by:

- Support Local Business 54%
- Flooding 53%
- Public Transit 37%
- Lighting of Streets and Sidewalks 37%

What improvements would you like to see on 4th Ave? List Top 3

- Greening (trees, median planters and open space) 81%
- Improved Flood Mitigation 57%
- More Sanitation 51%

Followed by:

- Events/Program for Street Life 35%
- Art Installations 28%
- Improved Lighting 25%
- Improved Public Transit 24%
- More Benches 15%

Fast Survey Facts:

Who: 605 respondents to online survey, as of 4/24/2024

<u>When</u>: This report reflects responses from 3/17/24 - 4/24/24; Survey responses were collected via Google Forms, with email verification

<u>Affiliations</u>: Respondents named over 40 different organizations that they were affiliated with representing block associations, schools, community and civic groups, community gardeners, social service organizations, businesses, landlords and residents along the 4th Ave Corridor.

<u>Questions</u>: Over 150 specific questions were directed to elected officials and city agencies, though many were observations or concerns rather than traditional questions. A summary of comments will be forwarded to the respective parties.

<u>Outreach</u>: Partners were asked to share the survey widely and post in e-newsletters and on Facebook/Twitter/Instagram feeds. Also posted to the FOFA google group and other local email groups, with additional outreach by several elected official offices and Community Board 6. There was personal outreach to several new condos along 4th Ave with emails and printed flyers.






